Martha Elizabeth Corbin passed away peacefully on Saturday February 16, 2013 at 6:35 a.m. from a foot infection caused by years of Hypertension that eventually caused Peripheral Vascular Disease. She was born March 31, 1915 and would have been 98 years old a little over a month from now.

Elizabeth was the oldest daughter of nine siblings of parents, Joseph Littleton Corbin and Mary Hayward Corbin and was known as sister, aunt, sis or Nana by her siblings, family and grandchildren. It was her dream and desire to live to be 100 years old and had she lived two more years she would have reached that goal! Elizabeth spent many years in New York working and eventually settled in
