Maurice received his early education in the public schools of Salisbury, MD and graduated from Wicomico High School in 1963. He graduated from Strayer University with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Computer Science and Information Systems. As a result of his academic achievements, he was recruited soon after graduation to work on a data project for the Washington, DC Metro transit system. He was an expert in the COBOL and Fortran programming languages. Maurice was highly sought after for his experience and expertise with main frame computer systems. Despite many obstacles for African Americans during that period, Maurice was able to make a name for himself in the early years of the computer programming field.

After retiring from his career in information systems, he decided to return to his beloved home on the Eastern Shore. He worked for numerous organizations in the Salisbury area which included the Wicomico County Environmental Health Department, where he worked with pesticides to help maintain the local ecosystem. He also worked on the construction of the Fulton Hall building at Salisbury University. Many remember Maurice in his recent line of work in local transportation. He enjoyed working with his clients, many of whom became friends. He was known to rise early to get his work completed for the day, always saying, "The early bird gets the worm."

Maurice's friends and family enjoyed his deep intellect and conversation on many diverse topics. In his early years, he enjoyed swinging his racket in a good game of tennis. Maurice was a lifelong student of the game of chess and enjoyed reading books on various gambits and strategies. Recently, he rekindled his love for tournaments and participated in the Wicomico County Parks & Recreation Chess Tournament where he proudly won 3rd place. He is preceded in death by his mother and father Mary and Preston Pinkett Sr., brother Preston Pinkett II, and son Maurice Pinkett II.

Maurice leaves behind loving memories with his three children: Denine Jones, Markel Waters (Erica), and Malik Pinkett; five grandchildren: Phalon and Shamia Jones, Juwan and Tori Palmer, and Ariana Pinkett; three great grandchildren: Sophia Jones, Braylen and Janiyah Palmer along with a host of aunts, uncles, cousins, and friends.
