Norman Ellsworth Sisco was born June 1, 1920 in Skinner's Neck, Rock Hall, MD. He was the son of William Ellsworth Sisco and Cassie Nichols. He was the fifth child of ten children. Norman was affectionately known as "Barney" and "Big Chief." Norman was 92 years young.

He was preceded in death by his parents; two sisters, Iola and Ida; four brothers, Oliver, Asbury, Nelson and Luther.

Norman, a quiet man, loved the Lord, sports, his family and life in general. He possessed great strength, had a great sense of humor and was a man of undeniable integrity. He was a member of Aaron Chapel United Methodist Church in Rock Hall, MD. Norman was also a member of the American Legion and the Elks. He was a famous first baseman for the Rock Hall Tigers, a Negro baseball league and a member of the Veterans Foreign Wars ("VFW").

Norman was a World War II Veteran, Army Air Corps (Air Force). While in the service, Norman attended Morehouse/Spellman College and Atlanta University in Georgia.

On July 21, 1951, Norman married the former Jean L. Rochester of Rock Hall, MD and she remained his loving wife of 61 years. Norman had seven children: Mary Ann Hamilton, Juanita Jones, Sherbert (Loretta Pat) Sisco, Consuvella

Sisco-Jones, Cynthia A. Moore, Bessie Turner and Jeffrey (Wanda) Sisco.
