



## Pearl Louise Boston (Hunt)

April 4, 1919 - November 26, 2017

Pearl Louise Boston was born April 4, 1919, on a farm outside of Trenton, Florida, in Gilchrest County, to Elizabeth Davis Hunt and John Andrew Hunt. Pearl was the fifth of nine children. She was preceded in death by six of her siblings and her son, James Randolph Robinson.

On July 29, 1939, Pearl Hunt married Rufus Robinson. From this union came three children, Stella, Fred and James. Rufus Robinson preceded her in death on February 7, 1963, in Williston, Florida. Pearl moved to Denton, Maryland in 1963, where she later met and married John Henry Boston, Sr. who preceded her in death in February 1989, in Denton, Maryland.
