



## Percell M. Kee

Percell McCoy Kee, affectionately known as “Skeet”, was born on October 13, 1959, at Milford Memorial Hospital in Milford, Delaware. He was the first of five children born to the late McCoy Wesley Kee and Shirlene Kee. Since Percell was the eldest and the only son, he was the sole guardian over his four lovely sisters.

Percell graduated from Cape Henlopen High School, in 1979. While there, he participated in the Vocational Education program, studying horticulture. He also ran track throughout his high school years. He loved his alma mater, frequently attending their football and basketball games, including when both his nephew, Tywuan Johnson and his son, Dominique Kee, began playing for the Vikings. He also attended many of the games played by his two step-sons, Chad & Eric.

Percell worked at various occupations during his lifetime. He was a faithful and hard worker with a high reputation among the employers as being very dependable. This reputation resulted in him being a line supervisor at Mountaire before medically retiring.

Percell was an avid Dallas Cowboys fan and the most you would ever see him riled up was when the Cowboys were playing one of their Division rivals, especially the Eagles. He was a quiet soul and was referred to by everyone

he knew or met as “the nicest man they had ever known.” He was one of the easiest persons to get along with and loved his family very much.
