Phyllis was educated in the public schools of Somerset County, Maryland and graduated from the former Somerset Junior/Senior High School in Princess Anne, Maryland. After graduating, Phyllis was employed for a number of years with the former Campbell Soup Company. In 1988 she started her own business, The Busy Bees Day Care, where she has taken care of many children from our community until now. Phyllis loved to keep house plants alive and vibrant in her home; we could say she had a “green thumb.” She enjoyed baking her famous Sweet Potato Pies and her delicious “Flop Cakes.” She enjoyed playing Uno and checkers with family and friends, and working on Sudoku puzzles.
