Preciosa Nacinopa Dunlap, age 75, passed peacefully on Thursday, January 25, 2018 at Bayhealth Kent General Hospital, after her courageous fight with cancer. Preciosa was born on December 29, 1942, in Samar, Philippines, and the daughter of Ruperto Crame and Felisa Nacinopa Crame.

Preciosa loved and enjoyed spending time with her family, traveling, swimming, cooking, crocheting, line dancing, jewelry designing and sewing.
