Marie was held in such high regard for the care and love she and her husband gave to foster children. Even after the passing of her husband, she was able to continue as a single foster parent. Marie's other happy moments were giving birth to her daughters, being there for the births of her grandchildren and great grandchildren and being able to help love and guide them into being caring people. She made sure every child in her family was over-prepared for starting school. Marie loved to sew and bake. She broadened her talents with a baking class. Marie worked for Townsend Inc. in Millsboro (now known as Mountaire) for over 20 years. When the plant converted to machines, although in her 60's, she went back to school and reinvented herself. Marie then cared for people with mental disabilities and traumatic brain injuries for almost 20 years.

Radia was preceded in death by her husband, James N. Balfour; father, Milton E. Tull; mother, Auntonette M. Wiltbank Tull and her oldest daughter, Auntonette M. Balfour.
