Reba Vernet, beloved daughter of the late Robert Reynolds and Lillie Bell Reynolds was born March 16, 1935, and departed this life on Thursday, February 22, 2018. Her favorite saying was "I'm holding on to that knot." The Lord told her to "let go of the knot and come get your crown."
