Robert “Bobby” M. Isaacs, was born on Johnstontown Road, in Quaker Neck, Maryland, on July 20, 1945, to the late William and Vivian Isaacs. He departed this life on March 23, 2019.

As a child, Bobby was brought to church, whether he wanted to come or not. He attended Emmanuel U.M. Church and accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior as a teenager. do. He loved wearing rodeo attire and his cowboy hats. Additionally, Bobby was a good gardener. He also enjoyed cooking and grilling all types of foods, and most of all, eating those Maryland crabs, picking them with his special tools.

Bobby moved to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in 1965, where he met and married the late Doris Franks, and from this union they had a daughter, Dorrisa L. Bateman. In the 70's, Bobby moved to New Stanton, Pennsylvania, and enjoyed living in Southwestern, PA. In 1996, he met Veronica Jones, the love of his life, and married her on November 21, 1998. Bobby gave his wife the nickname "Muffin", even though her family called her VJ. Bobby and Muffin moved to Chestertown in 2015, to live in the old home place where he grew up.
