Robert L. Massey, Sr., aka “Bob Pinkney”, departed this life on Friday, April 6, 2018, at the Caroline Hospice Home in Denton, MD. He was born to the late Sarah Massey Wilkerson and Neman Pinkney on November 26, 1933, in Pondtown, MD.

Bob attended school in Queen Anne’s County, Maryland. In 1954 he enlisted in the United States Air Force and served as an Air Policeman at Lackland AFB, San Antonio, Texas and in Okinawa, Japan during the Korean War.

Bob drove tractor trailers for fifty years for various companies including; Walls Trucking (Sudlersville, MD), Hanks Seafood, Fox Trucking (Easton, MD), and Premier Trucking. His CB handle was “Dr. Soul.”

Bob was united in Holy Matrimony to the late Lois Fletcher of Barclay, MD on May 10, 1958. To this union, six children were born.

His hobbies included shooting pool, pitching horseshoes, playing and watching baseball, fishing, playing the bongos, and watching his favorite daytime tv shows which included westerns.
