Robert Reddick, Sr., beloved son of the late Charles Pete Reddick, also known as Cicero Little, and Beatrice Tucker Reddick, was born on February 22, 1942, in Manokin, Maryland. He received his well-earned eternal rest on February 6, 2026, at Coastal Hospice at the Lake in Salisbury, Maryland.

Robert, affectionately known as “Bob” and “Bobcat,” was lovingly raised by Emmett and Lula Cotton of Manokin, Maryland. He attended Somerset County Public Schools, where he developed into a determined and goal-oriented young man. From an early age, Robert had a strong love for basketball and could often be found somewhere enjoying the game. He was also known for being money-minded, always thinking ahead, setting goals, and working diligently to provide and build for the future. His ambition and drive were evident throughout his life.

Robert attended Samuel Wesley United Methodist Church in Manokin, Maryland. It was there that he gave his life to Christ and strengthened his faith in God. He remained committed to his spiritual walk throughout his life and made it a priority to attend special services and church occasions whenever he could.
