Robert Lee Thompson, Jr. was born on June 7, 1946 in Baconton, Georgia to Robert Lee Thompson, Sr. and Hattie P. Thompson. He was the third older child of eight children.

Robert began his life in Mitchell County, GA. His parents moved to Secretary , MD in 1946. He had his early education at Hurlock Elementary School in Hurlock, MD in 1951. He attended Maces Lane High School in Cambridge, MD.

Robert worked 10 years for Dick Van Burge of St. Michaels, MD, where he got his start in landscaping. In the mid 80s, he started his own landscaping business. He serviced all of St. Michaels, Easton and the surrounding areas. In 2008, he retired from Christ Church of St. Michaels after 18 years of service.
