April 27, 1962 - February 29, 2016

Ronald Harvey Johnson, Jr. was born on April 27, 1962 to Evelyn Perry Johnson and the late Ronald H. Johnson, Sr. He passed away suddenly on Monday, February 29, 2016 in Lewes, Delaware.

Ronald, fondly known as “Harvey” to family and friends, was raised in the Lewes area. He was educated in the Cape Henlopen School District. In the 11th grade, he joined the ROTC. After graduation from high school in 1980, Harvey joined the United States Army. He received an Honorable Discharge on February 21, 1984.

Harvey loved sports. He was a top middle weight wrestler at Cape Henlopen High School. In 1978-79, he was selected to be a member of the High School All-American Honor Program.

Harvey was a fun-loving person who loved to dance, sing and read. He showed great respect for the elderly and would help anyone and everyone if he could. He would give you anything that he had. If he borrowed anything, he would always pay it back no matter how long it took.

Family was important to Harvey. He was well liked and he, too, genuinely loved people. He was especially fond of his nieces and nephews. The kids in the community loved him, often calling him “Uncle or Cousin Ronnie”. Harvey could often be heard singing early in the morning or while walking down the street, “I’m just a nobody trying to tell everybody about somebody who can save anybody”.

Harvey was preceded in death by his father, Ronald Harvey Johnson, Sr. in

1993 and his brother, Clarence Johnson in 2003.

He leaves to cherish precious memories his mother, Evelyn Perry Johnson; two brothers, Gawain Johnson of Millsboro, DE and Eric Johnson of Lewes, DE; two sisters, Naomi Johnson of Millsboro, DE and Cecelia Johnson of Coolspring, DE; and a host of aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
