Russell Leon Brown, Jr. departed this life on Wednesday, March 19, 2014, at the Talbot Hospice Center in Easton, Maryland. He was 84 years old.

Affectionately known as "Buck," he was born on August 22, 1929, in Dorchester County to the late Russell and Elsie Mae Brown.

He was educated in the Dorchester County Public School System. He served in the United States Armed Services from 1951- 1953. He was employed for 28 years by the State of Maryland.
