### SANDRA'S JOURNEY

Sandra Lee Bailey Moore, the daughter of the late McKelery and Frances C. Bailey, was born on August 20, 1940 in Salisbury, Maryland. She peacefully departed this life on January 22, 2022 in her home on Polks Road in Princess Anne, Maryland.

She received her formal education in the public schools in Somerset County, Princess Anne Maryland, where she graduated and continued to further her education in English and computer Keyboarding at Wor-Wic Community College in Salisbury, Maryland.

She was employed at Green Giant Company in Fruitland, Maryland and Campbell Soup Company in Salisbury, Maryland, from where she retired after thirty-three (33) years of employment. After leaving Campbell Soup, Sandra worked at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) in food service for twenty (20) years.
