“ This is Sandy's daughter, Jessica. I don't have a username or password to update my mom's information. I am writing an obituary for her hometown, where I currently reside. Here is my mom's information, including correct date of death which was April 1st, not the 3rd. Thank you:

Tyaskin, MD- Sandra Kay "Sandy" (Burton) Wheeler, 61, of Tyaskin, MD, died Saturday, April 1st, 2017 at Coastal Hospice on the Lake, Salisbury, MD after a year long battle with a rare type of non Hodgkin lymphoma.

Born on April 5th, 1955, in Cumberland, MD, she was the only daughter of the late Raymond Joseph Burton, SR and Deloris Marie (Everett) Miller. Sandy was preceded in death by two late husbands, Thomas Lee "Tom" Witt and Paul Donald Goetz, JR, as well as her father, Raymond Joseph Burton, SR, and step father, Charles " Charlie" Edward Miller, JR.

Sandy was a 1973 graduate of Allegany High School, with soon after graduating, attending a beauty academy (name unknown) and passing her boards. Sandy was a former employee of Big Lots of Cumberland, MD before transferring to Big Lots of Myrtle Beach, SC, upon relocation. Her most recent employer was Dollar General of Surfside Beach, SC. Sandy was Christian by faith.

Surviving are Sandy's husband, John W. Wheeler of Tyaskin, MD, who was fighting by her side for the past year. Her mother, Deloris Marie (Everett) Miller of Cumberland, MD, and her brother Raymond Joseph "Joey" Burton, JR and wife Tammy of Eckhart, MD. Her daughter, Jessica (Witt) Moore and husband Richard, and their three children, who were Sandy's greatest joys, grandchildren Azlynn Myriah Duckworth, for whom she was especially close with and shared a special bond , and Aurora Monroe and Gideon Lee Moore, all of Cumberland, MD. Stepdaughters Tiffany Krpata and Sandy's grandson, Kaiden Phoenix Cypher, of Fredericksburg, VA, and Ariel Wheeler and Sandy's grandson, Christian Reilly Liam Wheeler, of Holly Springs, NC.

Sandy is also survived by her mother in law, Helen, of Thomas, WV; nephews Aaron Burton of Eckhart, MD; Rob Burton and wife Summer and their 3 children, formerly of Cocoa Beach, FL; and

neices Lesley Burton and Tara Ziler and their children; cousins Hannah and Jacob Bowes and their daughters, of Tyaskin, MD, whom helped care for Sandy in the final stages of her life; and numerous aunts, cousins, and special friends, especially those who helped her during her battle with cancer.

No funeral services were planned as Sandy was cremated in her town of residence. A celebration of life may be held in her honor at a later date in her hometown of Cumberland, MD, to be determined.
