We Bid Farewell to “Shaun Michael Williams”

Shaun, Nibbles or Shaun-wen, as he was so fondly called when his mother wanted him to take care of something important, was the youngest child born to Deborah Ann Gates Williams and George Thomas Williams (deceased), departed this life early Monday morning, December 14, 2020 at TidalHealth Peninsula Regional in Salisbury, Maryland. Shaun was born and raised in Salisbury, but lived in Princess Anne, Maryland for the last three years. At an early age, he began staying overnight with his maternal grandmother, Ocie Jewel Gates, because he did not want her to be alone.

Shaun received his early childhood education in the Wicomico County School System, graduating from Parkside High School in 2000 after participating in the Maryland's Tomorrow Program where he and his brother Damien were members of the football team. He continued his educational training pursuing a Bachelor's Degree in General Studies at the University of Maryland, Eastern Shore and had completed over 30 credits.

As a youth, Shaun was active in St. James AME Zion Church and the community. He played drums for the Youth Choir, (even though he never had a drum lesson), participated in the Boy Scouts and Martial Arts. He was a member of the Music Ministry's sound and video systems. In his spare time, he taught himself to play the keyboard, focusing on Gospel Music.

Shaun had a passion for woodburning. He created beautiful African queens, animals, and people. A local store owner saw his artwork and asked to display it in his store; by the end of the day every piece was sold, and customers were requesting additional artifacts.

Shaun loved to share his personal testimony and relationship with God. This was evident at his daughter and nephew's graduation party in May when he commented: "I believe in God and His son, Jesus Christ, and I am not ashamed to acknowledge Him wherever I go. I'm not perfect, but I know where God has brought me from, and I will depend on him for the rest of my life." A few days before his transition, he said, "life can change in an instant."

Shaun often expounded on the different life lessons he learned and experienced. He found great comfort reading self-help books, the Bible, biographies, and documentaries.

Shaun loved church, and when questions were asked, he was able to give examples in layman's terms, helping others understand scriptural meanings. Because of this special gift, he was often asked to give mini-sermons that inspired his audience.

Shaun was a sincere person. If you asked him a question or wanted advice, he did not sugar-coat the answer. He loved to laugh and joke around; however, when it came to participating in activities, he strived to be professional to include his appearance. You could depend on him to finish the job; if he promised he was going to do something; his word was his bond.

Shaun was a member of the famous WE HERE Auto Club of Salisbury. His Crown Victoria moniker name was SUPERMAN. He prided himself in making a difference in the lives of others, whether giving out school supplies, organizing a health fair or homeless initiatives, he gave the best he had to give. Shaun took time to enjoy life. His smile and laughter will remain in our hearts forever.
