



## Shirley C. Daisey

Shirley Corinne (Street) Daisey, 79, of Dover, DE, passed away on Saturday, July 26, 2014.

Born on June 30, 1935, in Newport, NJ, she was the daughter of the late Martha Ann Street and the late Clarence Albert Street formerly of Millsboro, DE. She received her early education in Newport, but upon relocating to the Millsboro area she attended Hollyville School, Warwick #203, Richard Allen School, and William C. A proud wife, mother, and homemaker, Shirley focused her life on building a strong family. She was never happier than at family reunions, holiday gatherings or just visiting with her friends and relatives. Making the holidays or any family get-together memorable seemed to be her mission. She delighted in others enjoying the food she prepared, and was not too humble to compliment herself. Known for her chicken n' dumplings, fried chicken, strawberry short cake, sweet potato pie, homemade ice cream, and decorated cakes, among other culinary delights, which along with her welcoming smile and warm embrace, made homecomings very special for everyone.

years, becoming a Melvin Jones Fellow. Shirley was also a long time Y-Teen leader, and enjoyed membership in the local "Birthday Club." Her love of children guided her in helping to counsel and make a difference in the lives of a number of youth over the years, including partially raising several extended family members. Her often stated belief that "no one is better than me, and I am not better than anyone else" has kept her family confident yet grounded.
