I departed this life on Wednesday, September 10, 2014 in Chester River Hospital Center. I weighed 7lbs, 9oz. I 20.5 inches long. My mother is Dorothy A. Sisco. My father is George A. Hynson.

I was a happy baby boy and toddler. When I was three years old, I had an accident that involved my arm going through the glass part of my grandmother's kitchen door. I was rushed to the hospital and I received eight stitches.

From a young child, I grew to love fishing, I would fish day and night, no matter what the weather was like. My Christian upbringing was from Aaron's Chapel U.M. Church. I later gave my life to Christ, under the leadership of Rev. Carol Hopkins.

My early education was received at Rock Hall Elementary and Rock Hall Middle Schools. After graduating, from Kent County High School, I attended Chesapeake Community College, where I studied Computer Technology. My next venture was to seek a Culinary Arts Career. I attended the Culinary School of Arts in Baltimore, MD.

Next, I worked for Local #199 Union for several years, before gaining employment at Kent County Detention, where I served various food services, Compass food service and Trinity food service. But my greatest job was that of being a wonderful son and a loving and devoted daddy.

I was preceded in death by my grandparents, Pop-Pop Emmett Sisco and George and Jeanette Hynson.

I leave to cherish my memory a devoted loving mother, Dorothy A. Sisco; my father, George A.
