Thelma Lyda Clash, daughter of the late John W. and Lena B. Lyda, was born April 8, 1921, in Terre Haute, Indiana.

Thelma received her early education in the public schools of Terre Haute. She graduated with Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees in elementary education from Indiana State University. She also attended Morgan State College and the University of Maryland. For thirty-two years, Mrs. Clash taught in the elementary schools of Easton, Maryland, located in Talbot County.

Most of her life was spent in Indiana and in Cambridge, Maryland. An interest in the education of youth was one of the major thrusts in her life.

Mrs. Clash received her religious training at the Second Missionary Baptist Church in Terre Haute, where her parents were very active in all departments of the church. When she married Charles H. Clash of Cambridge, Maryland, she joined the Bethel A.M.E. Church in Cambridge. At Bethel, she was a member of the Missionary Society and the Scholarship Committee.

Her community, civic and professional activities included being a nursing home volunteer, tutoring, member of the National Teachers Association (NEA), Maryland State Teachers Association (MSTA), Talbot and Dorchester

County Retired Teachers Associations, Delta Sigma Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., the Noddables Social Club, Literary Club and the Harriett Tubman Association.

Mrs. Clash is survived by two nieces, Meredith Morrow and Kimberly Lyda of Temple, GA; cousins, Lucille & Charles Lyda and family of Saginaw, Michigan and Rosetta Monman and Eddie Monman of Ohio; a sister-in-law, Minnie Lyda of Indiana; and friends.
