Thomas Samuel Boston, Sr. was born on May 12, 1948, to the late Robert Lee Boston, Sr. and Evelyn Louise Brinkley in Marion Station, Maryland. He peacefully transitioned to his eternal home in Glory at 2:00 am on Friday, September 18 after his courageous battle with Renal Failure leading to Dialysis for nearly sixteen (16) years. He received his education in the Somerset County public school system. Thomas was self-educated and became a professional truck driver, but also worked at Farmers and Planters and Pocahontas. Years later, he retired from Laundry Laundromat.
