Thomas Wilson Brown, Jr., was born September 10, 1942, in Chestertown, Maryland. He passed from this earth on December 6, 2018, in Chestertown, Maryland, at the age of 76.

During his childhood he lived in Chestertown, Maryland and graduated in the Class of 1960, from Garrett Senior High School.

After high school, Thomas enlisted in the United States Air Force and was trained as an Aircraft Fuel Systems Mechanic. Shortly thereafter, he welcomed his first son, Anthony. He served several overseas tours of duty, including England and Vietnam, as well as numerous stateside assignments.
