Tiffany Wynette Warrington of Baltimore, Maryland went home to be with the Lord on Friday, April 28, 2017. at the age of thirty– two (32). She was the daughter of George & Anna Warrington, born on November 3, 1984 in Salisbury, Maryland. She was the youngest of 3 siblings.
