Virgil Thomas Roper, of Princess Anne, MD, passed away on Monday, April 3, 2017 at Peninsula Regional Medical Center in Salisbury, Maryland. He was sixty-nine (69) years old.

He was the son of Pauline Virginia Cottman Roper of Salisbury, Maryland and the late Desmond Bailey of Hollywood, Florida. Virgil was a graduate of Salisbury High School, and attended the University of Maryland Eastern Shore in Princess Anne, Maryland.
