June 6, 1945 - May 8, 2017

Wallace (Wally) Edward Hayman, a resident of Delmar, Delaware, was granted his angel wings at the age of seventy-two (72), on Monday, May 8, 2017 as a result of a long battle of illnesses. Wallace Hayman, son of the late James Jolley and Priscilla Hayman, was born on April 6, 1945 in Mardela, Maryland. He graduated from Salisbury High School in Salisbury, Maryland in 1964. He married his best friend, Joan Holland, on September 25, 1971 in Sharptown, Maryland.

Wallace was employed by Campbell Soup (Salisbury, Maryland), Dupont (Seaford, Delaware) and General Motors (Newport, Delaware), from where he retired in 2000, after working there for 26 years.
