Chestertown - William Raymond (Bill) Crooks, Jr. died unexpectedly on January 15, 2025 at his home in Chestertown, at the age of 76. He was born on April 8, 1948 in Bryn Mawr, PA, the youngest of five children, to the late Raymond and Margery (Masters) Crooks. Bill was predeceased by his parents and a sister, M. Louise (Andrew) Sokso. He is survived by sisters Joyce (John) Jackson of Delaware, OH, Barbara (William) Coffey, West Chester, PA and Elizabeth (David) Lewis, Morton, PA, fifteen nephews and nieces, the oldest of whom, Deborah and her husband, Raymond Forney, of Chestertown, provided Bill with care during the past few years. Bill came to Chestertown with his parents in 1964. After graduating from Chestertown High School, he spent four years in the U. S. Navy, a year of that time in Vietnam. Upon his discharge he briefly attended Washington College and Frostburg College. In his adult years, Bill enjoyed much of what living close to the Chesapeake Bay offers: playing lacrosse, crewing a long canoe, hunting and spending time with friends out on the water. Bill practiced the carpentry trade and many historic homes on the Eastern Shore exhibit his talents as a restorer. Services and interment private.
