William “Wesley” Commodore was born on March 16, 1920 to the late William and Rachel Scott Commodore and departed this life on Thursday, October 31, 2013.

Wesley was educated in the Kent County, Maryland Public Schools. He joined John Wesley Church in Sandy Bottom, Maryland when he was 21 years of age under the leadership of the Reverend John H. Hubbard. He later attended Janes United Methodist Church in Chestertown, Maryland.

Wesley was employed at the Richard (Dick) Kimble Farm for 56 years, working the first 21 years without missing a scheduled workday. After leaving Kimble Farms, he joined his brother Franklin in his landscaping business.

He also enjoyed the movies and watching television. His favorite television shows were The Wild Kingdom and the old-time western shows.

Wesley was introduced to the late Mary Elizabeth Williams by a mutual friend. They were united in marriage on November 4, 1971, and were married for 35 years until her death in 2006. Together, they enjoyed fishing and gardening.

In addition to his parents and his wife, Wesley was preceded in death by his five brothers and two sisters. Wesley is survived by “his girls”, Mary Ann Brown (Earl), Doris Gilbert and Gloria Holmes, their children and grandchildren. He is also survived by his sisters, Clara Virginia and Lollie Louise; sisters-in-law, Janet Hill Commodore and Margaret Thompson Commodore; and a host of nephews, nieces, cousins and friends.
