Obituary

William C. Spicer, Jr., a resident of Salisbury, Maryland, was born on June 8, 1944 in Pocomoke, Maryland. He died on October 22, 2023 at the age of seventy-nine (79) at Hartley Hall Nursing Home in Pocomoke City, Maryland.

William was educated in the Worcester County public school system. He served in the United States Navy, receiving the National Defense Service Medal and an honorable discharge in June 1967. As a young man, William had four sons. He later relocated from Pocomoke City, Maryland and moved to Trenton, New Jersey, where he lived for many years. After moving to New Jersey, he married the late Burnice Spicer and they had three children from that union. Later in life, William also had two other sons. William was employed by US Steel, Congoleum Corp and City of Trenton Office of Aging as a driver, from which he retired. After he retired, he relocated and settled into his home in Salisbury, Maryland.

William spoke his mind and had a way of making people laugh with his wit and snappy comments. He could talk for hours with people he encountered and loved to reminisce and tell stories. He never forgot a face or name. William enjoyed going out daily to “play his numbers” and watching sports games and
